A message from Fr. Radomir ...

Christ is in our midst!

How Can You Become More Christ-like Right now?
And Help Strengthen Your Parish – At The Same Time

As an Orthodox Christian, you know that the purpose of your life *is to become more Christ-like*.

The Holy Fathers of the Orthodox Church talk a lot about:

- *imitating Christ*
- *seeing Christ in your neighbor*
- *always having Christ at the front of your mind and heart.*

And that's what we – as Orthodox Christians -- are called to do.

Because one of the greatest dangers in your spiritual life is assuming that we're super close with God, while -- in reality -- being very far away from Him.

I could tell you that the best way to become more Christ-like is to commune frequently – because *you are what you eat*. So, if you prepare diligently and unite with Him frequently, you *will* become more like Him.

(The reason Christ decided to make Communion in the form of food and drink is so that He can become an integral part of our bodies. So that His grace cannot be easily taken away from us.)

But you already knew that. So, I won't talk about that.

What else can you do to become more Christ-like today?

I suggest a two-step approach.

1. Find a person who annoys you.

Think about what bothers you about them. It could be the way they walk, it could be their facial expression, their tone of voice, it could be their noisy kids, it could be that they're constantly talking about how you need to take Communion, etc.

Now go and tell everybody you meet about how annoying they are. I'm joking. Do NOT do that.

Found them? Check. Good job! Halfway done. But – *if you want to become more Christ-like* – do NOT skip the *following* step.

2. Pray for them.

I know this is hard. Especially if they've been annoying you for years. But you *have* to do this step. Otherwise, you're stuck in phase one. And that's definitely NOT Christ-like or beneficial to your salvation.

But I have to forewarn you about a hidden danger here. IF you've found that it's super easy to pray for people you dislike, take care.

Because if you're praying along these lines: "God, can you please stop them from being so annoying!", you're playing right into the devil's scaly hands. Do NOT pray this way. It's the way of the pharisee (As in: "I'm so much better than this annoying person!")

A better way would be to say: "God, I find this person annoying. Please forgive me and help *them* and *me* in our struggles."

That's it. Simple, yet so powerful.

Look at what you did here:

You were honest. You didn't pretend that you love them. You admitted that you are not perfect, and that someone annoys you. Did you go and gossip about this person? No!

Instead of venting to someone else -- thus spreading the evil -- you went to God Himself, Who is not only your and your annoying friend's Creator ... He also is the source of all *good*. You brought Him your sin, so He can transform it – and you – through your sincere prayer.

You went and asked the Lord for forgiveness and help, and you prayed for your annoyer (is that a word?).

And if you prayed from the heart, God *will* help you.

When you do this regularly, when you make an effort to refrain from talking behind people's backs, when you pray instead of vent, **you will be actively working on your salvation**. You **will** become more Christ-like. And you'll even strengthen your parish.

Because prayer makes everything better. Jesus Christ prayed for the people who were crucifying Him. If you think you can do that, but can't pray for a person who's annoying you, you're lying to yourself.

Think about what it's going to be like if everyone prayed for each other? This is one of the reasons why God allows these people in your life: so you run to HIM for help – as often as possible. This way you will rely more on Him, strengthen your relationship with Him, and realize that you should be grateful for irritating behaviors. Because even other people's quirks and peculiarities can move you closer to God.

Try it. Watch your relationships transform. Watch as your parish transforms. And see if this doesn't bring you to become more Christ-like.

Христос је међу нама!

Како можете постати Христолики управо сада?
И помоћи у јачању ваше парохије – истовремено

Као православни хришћанин, знате да је сврха вашег живота да постанете сличнији Христу тј Христолики.

Свети Оци Православне Цркве много говоре о:

- *имитирању Христа*
- *виђењу Христа у ближњем*
- *увек имати Христа на првом месту у свом уму и срцу.*

И то је оно што смо ми – као православни хришћани – позвани да чинимо.

Јер једна од највећих опасности у вашем духовном животу је претпоставка да смо изузетно блиски са Богом, док смо – у стварности – веома далеко од Њега.

Могао бих вам рећи да је најбољи начин да постанете Христолику често причешћивање – јер сте оно што једете. Дакле, ако се марљиво припремате и често сједињујете са Њим, постаћете сличнији Њему.

(Разлог зашто је Христос одлучио да причешћује у облику хране и пића јесте да би могао да постане саставни део наших тела. Да нам се Његова благодат не би лако одузела.)

Али то сте већ знали. Зато о томе нећу говорити.

Шта још можете учинити да бисте данас постали сличнији Христу?
Предлажем приступ у два корака.

1. Пронађите особу која вас нервира.

Размислите шта вас код њих нервира. То може бити начин на који ходају, израз лица, тон гласа, бучна деца, стално причају о томе како треба да се причешћујете итд.

Сада идите и реците свима које сретнете колико су досадни. Шалим се. НЕМОЈТЕ то радити.

Нашли сте их? Проверено. Одлично! На пола пута сте. Али – ако желите да постанете сличнији Христу – НЕМОЈТЕ прескакати следећи корак.

2. Молите се за њих.

Знам да је ово тешко. Поготово ако вас годинама нервирају. Али **морате** да урадите овај корак. У супротном, заглавили сте у првој фази. А то дефинитивно НИЈЕ Христово нити корисно за ваше спасење.

Али морам да вас упозорим на скривену опасност овде. АКО сте открили да је супер лако молити се за људе које не волите, пазите. Јер ако се молите у смислу: „Боже, можеш ли их молим те спречити да буду толико досадни!“, играте право у ђаволове руке. НЕ молите се на овај начин. То је начин фарисеја (као у: „Много сам бољи од ове досадне особе!“)

Бољи начин би био да кажете: „Боже, сматрам да је ова особа досадна. Молим те, опрости ми и помози њима и мени у нашим подвизима.“

То је то. Једноставно, ал’ моћно.

Погледајте шта сте овде урадили:

Били сте искрени. Ниси се претварао/ла да их волиш. Признао/ла си да ниси савршен/а и да те неко нервира. Јеси ли отишали и оговарали ту особу? Не!

Уместо да се изливаш неком другом -- ширећи тако зло -- отишао/ла си самом Богу, који није само твој и Твог досадног пријатеља Створитељ... Он је такође извор свег добра. Донео/ла си му свој грех, да га Он може преобразити – и тебе – кроз твоју искрену молитву.

Отишали си и замолили Господа за опроштај и помоћ, и молили си се за свог досадника.

И ако си се молили од срца, Бог ће **ти помоћи**.

Када ово редовно радиш, када се трудиш да се уздржиш од разговора иза леђа људи, када се молиш уместо да се жалите, **активно ћете радити на свом спасењу. Постаћете** сличнији Христу. Чак ћеш и ојачати своју парохију.

Јер молитва све чини бољим. Исус Христос се молио за људе који су га распињали. Ако мислите да то можете, али не можете да се молите за особу која вас нервира, лажете себе.

Размислите како би било када би се сви молили једни за друге? То је један од разлога зашто Бог дозвољава да ови људи буду у вашем животу: зато трчите Њему за помоћ – што је чешће то боље. На овај начин ћете се више ослањати на Њега, ојачати свој однос са Њим и схватити да треба да будете захвални на иритантном понашању. Јер чак и туђе чудности и особености могу вас приближити Богу.

Пробајте. Гледајте како се ваши односи мењају. Гледајте како се ваша парохија мења. И видите да ли вас ово неће довести до тога да постанете сличнији Христу.

Greetings to all,

We are now in the second half of the year of 2025 and I feel it is important to provide an update on our Parish.

As usual, it has been a very busy year for our St. George Parish. In addition to all of our yearly holiday celebrations and events, (Bozic, Nova Godina, Sveti Sava, Pascha, Slava, Serbfest, Bowling Tournament, EOYC Camp, Choir Ethnic Festival and most recently our Choir Concert Weekend) we celebrated the Ordination of Deacon Joseph Henre to the Priesthood. Axios! Axios! Axios! Fr. Joseph.

We had our new Bishop Serafim make a visit in February and then also in August to perform the Ordination. There were two members of the St. Sava Monastery Building Project, from Lake Forest, Illinois, that also came and provided a brief presentation on the progress of the renovation of the St. Mardarije Spiritual and Cultural Center. There are many ways for us as a church as well as individual parishioners to support this invaluable project. You will be receiving more information in the near future on how to support this renovation.

Coming up in October will be our Kolo's 101st Slava Celebration. Hopefully everyone will make it a priority to attend and support our Kolo who does so much for our church. Just a few weeks after that will be their Annual Fall Bazaar, number 56! Again, we will need everyone's support to make this event a success.

Our Annual Meetings for all of our organizations will begin in December. I encourage everyone to plan to attend and find out the happenings and be a part of the decisions being discussed.

We are looking for someone to chair our Nova Godina celebration. We have normally waited until December to look for volunteers, so I wanted to get this out now to allow for planning much earlier. If you are interested, please contact Brad Hijaz or me to discuss the responsibilities.

Again, our church attendance was down during the summer months compared to the last few years. I ask that you try to keep your financial support up to date. 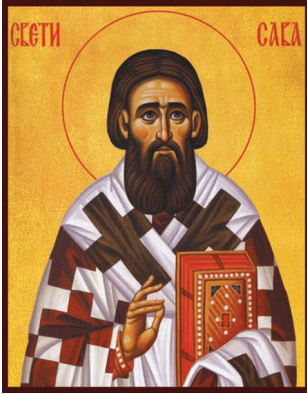

The individuals who staffed the booth - answering questions, selling items, and replenishing the inventory - were complimented on their friendliness and efficiency. We have to give a special shout out to "the Closer" - yes, Sasa, that's you!

Our booth was built and set up to make all welcome. The take down of the booth and packing up everything for next year was no easy task.

And did we mention, this was the HOTTEST weekend in Kansas City!

Many, many, many thanks to all who helped support our Choir in this endeavor.

Treasurer's Report ...

July 31st marks the end of the 3rd quarter of our fiscal year which runs from November 1st through October 31st.

- Please remember that weekly and holiday donations are the largest source of income to pay our operating expenses. Unfortunately, these donations are down over \$18,000 and \$3,000, respectively, for the same period last year. Thus, leading to a decrease in our income of \$17,000 from the previous year.
- Our total operating expenses, which include ongoing expenses – salaries, utilities, insurances, etc. are running over \$3,000 more than to this point last year.
- Due to these decreases in donations, we currently have a net loss for our operating accounts year-to-date of \$7,686. This has caused the deficit in our operating accounts totaling nearly \$50,000 the past two years.
- We continue to receive strong contributions towards our real estate accounts, which fund the large maintenance and repairs for the church. These include expenses related to the church roof, parking lot, doors, parish house. The parish home recently received updated windows at a cost of \$24,250. Recent updates to the church property include new piping in the basement for \$5,550 and power washing and painting of the hall exterior for \$8,000.
- It should be noted that we had another very successful Serbfest!!! We had a net profit of \$19,476, which allowed us to make our donation to Ronald McDonald House KC of \$1,500.

Like most of you, the church continues to see a rise in our expenses. As always, please remember to continue to give what you can. Your generous donations are needed to help our church continue to operate at healthy levels. To assist in making your donations more convenient, the Church has an option to pay on-line, please visit our website.

In addition to monetary donations, we always accept and appreciate people's time and talents to assist the church.

Donating to the Church ...

Do you ever wonder how the money is used that you donate to our Church? Here’s a brief overview:

- Weekly/Monthly Donations - These monies go into our Operating account to cover ongoing expenses - salaries, utilities, insurances, just to name a few.
- Maintenance Donations - Monies given weekly/monthly earmarked for maintenance and building go into our Real Estate account. These dollars are used to pay for major maintenance and building repair.
- Memorial Donations - These monies go into our Real Estate account to pay for major maintenance and building repair.
- Church Dues - Annual dues for members is \$150 per person. The majority is given to our Midwest Diocese based on our assessment. As of August 31, we have a total of 130 paid members. Our list of parishioners is over 200.

At our Annual Assembly, the Treasurer reviews our financials. Reports show monies coming in and major expenses for the year. We also discuss major impacts to the budget for the following year.

Donations can be given by cash, check, or conveniently through our website, www.st-george-church.org. Using the website, one-time donations can be given as well as automatic, on-going monthly donations.
